Rotarians are People of Action who live out Service above Self.

People of Action Projects: Last year, we launched People of Action Projects--service opportunities created and selected by Rotarians. Members joined together to host students and their parents from W.O. Smith at the Nashville Symphony. We also gathered at Project C.U.R.E. to sort and pack donated medical supplies to be sent to underserved countries.

Backpacks with Second Harvest: Every month of the school year, Rotarians gather at Second Harvest Food Bank to pack 1,225 food packs to be distributed to children who experience food insecurity on the weekend.

Feed the Need- We celebrated our 22nd Feed the Need this year as Rotarians, along with their friends and family, gathered for 3 service opportunities, packing and delivering food boxes to over 2,000 of our neighbors in need. This year, we added a mobile distribution site at Watkins Park Community Center.

Habitat for Humanity- In November and May, we worked to build homes for our neighbors. We painted and put finishing touches on a home in November and raised the roof at our spring build in May.

Book 'em- Rotarians met with an assigned classroom several times throughout the year, delivering a story and a free book for each child.

Warner Elementary- We continued to support teachers and staff at Warner Elementary by catering a teacher appreciation lunch as school ended in May.

Rotaract is an opportunity to be involved in Rotary for college students and young professionals. We sponsor two Rotaract Clubs. Internationally, there are nearly 11,000 active Rotaract Clubs.

Fisk Rotaract: Fisk Rotaract Club was founded in 2015 and is thriving on campus at Fisk University. Fisk Rotaractors meet regularly to learn from community leaders and serve the community. Rotarians Chad Jones and Clint Story served as chairs for this committee.

Rotaract of Nashville: In 2023, we launched Rotaract of Nashville, a Nashville Rotary sponsored opportunity for top-notch young professionals ages 22-35. Rotaract of Nashville has grown to over 80 founding members. Rotaract of Nashville meets once a month to learn from timely and relevant speakers. The second monthly gathering alternates between a service opportunity and fellowship event.
