Fred Findlay introduced one of our Rotary Global Grant Scholars, Tallan Donine, and the

members of the Global Grant Scholars Committee: **Deb Raupp, George Falardeau, Lynn Sullivan, PP Cory Brendel, Alex Boekelheide, Paul Martin,** and **Jeannine Bogaard**. Tallan just graduated from Claremont McKenna University and is headed to the University of Edinburgh, where she will be pursuing a master's degree in law. Tallan worked at the Holocaust Museum in Washington, DC as an undergraduate and hopes to focus on genocide prevention using the tools of law. President Justene then turned the program over to Catherine Haskett Hany, chair of the Paul Harris Fellow Committee. Catherine gave a brief biography of Paul Harris, who was a Chicago lawyer who co-founded Rotary in 1905 and was its third president in 1907. Catherine explained how Rotary became the first-ever service club when, in 1907, it installed public toilets in downtown Chicago. Since then, Rotary's service has only expanded and currently its seven areas of service are promoting peace; fighting disease; providing clean water, sanitation, and hygiene; saving mothers and children; supporting education; growing local economies; and protecting the environment. Catherine explained that one of Rotary International's major accomplishments is the polio eradication effort, which is this close to being completed.

The Paul Harris Society, Catherine explained, is the highest honor for Rotarians who have contributed to the Rotary Foundation, which funds all these worthy international service projects. "The real meaning," she said, "is the knowledge that collectively we are supporting good works throughout the world – four billion dollars so far!" And another function of the Paul Harris Society is "to recognize non-Rotarian superstars, two of which are present today."

Before presenting our honorees, though, Catherine introduced the members of her committee, who evaluated the nominees and chose our awardees. **President Justene Adamec, Wendy Anderson** (watching on Zoom), **Mary Chalon, Jennifer DeVoll, PP Mike Farrand, PP Rob Fisher**, and **PP Cathy Simms** all stood and received a well-deserved round of applause.

First **Catherine** introduced the Rev. Canon William (Bill) Lane Doulos, founder of Union Station Homeless Services (among other good works), saving "no one in our community has made more of a difference in the lives of the truly needy. He even changed his name to "Doulos," which is Greek for "servant." In receiving the award, Bill noted that he's come full circle because in 1973 he was a student across the street at Fuller Theological Seminary and his first "big job" was at the University Club! "I'm glad to share this award with Charmayne and to join with all of you in making this a better community and a better world."

Bill received certificates o recognition from the City of Pasadena, Assemblymember Holden, and State Senator Portantino. **President Justene** presented him with his Paul Harris Society pin, saying "this pin is very dear

to us, and we are glad you will be able to wear it."

Next, **Catherine** introduced Charmayne Mills Ealy, among whose accomplishments was being one of seven families who comprised Friends of Cleveland School for many years and is now co-founder and Director of Operations for STEAMCODERS, a non-profit that serves underserved and underrepresented students in science, technology, engineering, arts, and math. Charmayne said, "I am thankful for those who thought enough of me to submit my name to this great organization." She noted that her public service journey began 50 years ago at UCLA with Delta Sigma Theta, and "30 years ago I married Raymond, who exemplifies service above self!" She closed with this thought: "To whom much is given, much is expected." Charmayne received her certificates from the City, Assemblymember Holden, and State Senator Portantino, and **President Justene** proudly presented her with her Paul Harris Pin.

President Justene reminded everyone that next week is her last meeting as President, and we adjourned right on time at 1:30.
