President Kim then came to the podium and asked that Cathy Ponitz present a \$3,000 Dayton Rotary Foundation check to Elaine Bonner of Emerge Recovery. Elaine explained all the great work that Emerge is doing. Emerge is a new organization but is rooted in the spirit of entrepreneurship. All founding members are in long term recovery, and they are now paying it forward by giving many folks a second chance at life. Elaine expressed sincere gratitude for the Foundation gift. Bill Nance then interviewed Tracey Tomme, our fellow member who words for the Dayton Society of Natural History. She has been with that organization for 5 years and considers herself somewhat of a "fixer†with a special focus on financial issues. She explained that the Society has approximately 1.8 million objects in its archives and that the society started in the 1800's in the library. Wow factors include the Bieser Room, the Water Table, and the climbing structure at the Boonshoft Museum.

Kim Bramlage then presented "It's Been a Great Yearâ€, a slideshow highlighting all the great things that our club has accomplished and participated in over the year. She thanked us for our involvement and commitment to the club's mission. Rotary gave \$39,000 in grants, \$18,000 to International Rotary, \$8,000 to the Coats Plus project, Day 10's of \$15,000, \$5,000 towards the fight to eradicate Polio, and so much more. Kim went on to recognize certain club members for their special contributions. Specifically, Susan Taylor and Steve Nass for their Paul Harris work, Scott Kayser as Club Volunteer. Kim gave further recognition and thanks to many club members who helped her throughout the year including, Kelly Lehman, Walt Hibner, Lisa Grigsby, Linda Groover, Randy Domigan, Adam Horseman, Karla Garrett Harshaw, Frank Scott, Steve Naas, Bill Nance, Steve Conklin, Sarah Hippensteel Hall, and last but certainly not least Laua Erbaugh who makes everyone's jobs easier!

Kim then presented her President's pin to Randy and transferred the gavel. Kim was awarded a certificate of service and a Past President's pin. Randy gave a few opening remarks about his upcoming year as President. He announced that Heath MacAlpine, Lisa Grigsby and Chuck Vella will be Rotary Board members starting in July. Randy's administration will focus on membership, and he wants to introduce a weekly Rotary Spotlight so we can better introduce ourselves to one another.
