Every member of Punta Gorda Rotary should log in and learn to navigate at least the basics: finding club members, getting phone numbers and email addresses, checking the club calendar and the district calendar for events and activities, etc.

District Assembly/Leadership in Fort Myers

Incoming club leaders learned about their roles, developed leadership skills, and set goals for the 2024-25 Rotary Year. This was an opportunity to build a sense of community and collaboration among the clubs in our District 6960. The Assembly began with a business meeting, a highlight of which was the introduction of a legacy campaign and gala to be held in 2024. Joe Porkorney reported on the district's Disaster Relief Committee, Sharon Carter on addressing mental health in our communities, and Alfred Current gave a brief preview of the District Conference to be held on July 12-13 at the Charlotte Event and Conference Center in Punta Gorda.



Two breakout sessions followed, and participants chose from sessions on Membership, Global Grants & the Share Committee, Public Image, Treasurer's Training, District Grants & the Annual Fund, and Youth Services. A special PET's make-up session was held, which our incoming president, James, attended.

Recent Youth Scholarships and RYLA

High School Scholarship Recipients:

Braddock Marshall. This young man has served over 400 hours of community service. He is 20th in his graduating class of 441 with a 3.8 GPA; weighted 4.3.

Kaylee Zieglbauer. In addition to volunteering at a local animal shelter and library, this young lady is also a member of Key Club. With a GPA of 3.8, weighted at 4.4, she is 25th in her graduating class of 82 at Florida Southwestern Collegiate College.

Isaac Schaeffer. In addition to playing football and wrestling all of his four high school years at Charlotte High School, this young man completed his academic achievements at 3.4; weighted 3.9 GPA. He also managed to work three jobs, notably completing small jobs in his grandmother's neighborhood of the elder generation.

RYLA - Rotary Youth Leadership Academy

Each year, thousands of young people take part in the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) program worldwide. Young people are chosen for their leadership potential to attend an all-expenses-paid camp to discuss leadership skills and to learn those skills through practice. Rotary clubs and districts select participants and facilitate the event's curriculum.

RYLA aims to:

- Provide effective training experience for selected young people and potential leaders;
- Encourage leadership of youth by youth;
- Encourage young people to make a difference in their communities through volunteer work and social responsibility; and
- Demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth.

We listened to a snapshot of each of these recipients' experience at the leadership camp. They are certainly destined to be leaders of our future.
