Winchester | Healing Fields of Honor

On Memorial Day weekend the <u>Rotary Club of Winchester, VA</u> hosted its 4th annual Healing Field of Honor. The centerpiece of the event was over 800 United States flags arranged on the grounds of Handley High School. The Healing Field of Honor was visited by thousands over the long weekend.

The opening and closing ceremonies included first-hand accounts from veterans on the nature of those that serve and what Memorial Day weekend means to them. Flags were sponsored by an individual or group and affixed with a tag identifying the personal hero being honored by the display. In addition to members of the military, there were tags that paid tribute to police, firefighters, emergency medical personnel, family members and more.

The club also conducted an essay contest in which Middle School and High School

students shared their thoughts on this year's theme: "Our Heroes, Their Sacrificeâ€. Thursday's opening started early with veteran serving organizations staffing tents along "Heroes Hill†in outreach to those who served our nation. Then, over 30 motorcycles ended their memorial ride at the field and posted American flags as an event kickoff. Dodging thunderstorms in the area, the crowd was treated to a C-17 Air Force transport jet flyover and the arrival of two parachutists who slipped their way onto the wet grass and began a "USAI USAI USAI & Chant.

In addition to the funds raised, the event provided a meaningful Memorial Day Weekend focal point for the community. Through a combination of flag sales and corporate sponsorships, The Rotary Club of Winchester's Healing Field of Honor netted \$36,140 that will be distributed to local veterans through the VFW and three local Fire/EMS/Sheriff/Police nonprofits.
