

CLUB REPORT MAY 23, 2024

here's no typical day at the Lyman Allyn Art Museum, New London Rotarian Sophia Gipstein Scirico, who is learning and engagement coordinator for the museum, told New London club members at their regular luncheon meeting May 23.

Any given day might find her working on the museum's social media accounts, helping with event planning, participating in a gallery talk, helping with a visiting school group or any number of other duties. Because the museum has a relatively small staff, Gipstein Scirico said each staff member has opportunities to work on a wide variety of tasks.


When the Lyman Allyn Art Museum opened in 1932 near the south end of the Connecticut College campus, the museum had just 13 objects. Today, however, there are more than 17,000 objects in its collection and it hosts a variety of temporary exhibitions along with three permanent exhibits: one focused on American art, one on Louis Comfort Tiffany's influence in New London and one featuring historic toys and playthings.

"Things are always changing," she said of the museum.

In the 2022-2023 year, the museum served 3,200 children and 3,400 adults. In the 2023-2024 year, the museum has so far served 3,800 children and 2,600 adults. Included in these numbers were eleven organizations that visited the museum for the first time.

Gipstein Scirico said the museum covers the full cost of buses used to transport children from the New London Public Schools to the museum and half the cost of buses from other schools in New London County. In addition, 10 scholarships are earmarked to allow New London residents to attend one week of summer art immersion at the museum. That money is made available through New London Community Block Grants, she said.

To make the museum more enjoyable for all to navigate, it has developed some guides in languages other than English and also has compiled bags full of sensory items aimed at assisting children on the autism spectrum.



"We're trying to eliminate as many barriers as possible," she said.

One major change being planned at the museum is converting its expanse of lawn into a 12-acre urban park complete with sculptures. The park, for which the museum is currently fundraising, will also feature themed gardens, an open-air amphitheater and an ecologically active pond. Development of the park will help complete the vision of Harriet Upson Allyn, who provided the money to establish the museum in honor of her father Lyman Allyn. Lyman Allyn was a whaling captain during the 19th century, the heyday of that industry in New London. He also was a director of a banking company, a railroad and an insurance company.
