MOMENT OF IMPACT

Lori Mayfield - Lori spent most of her career in public service in Seattle. She spent 20 years working for an elected City Council member followed by 10 years working for the elected city attorney. Upon her first retirement in 1999 which lasted 6 months, Lori found herself in palm desert as the assistant to the general manager for the Westin Mission Hills Resort. She moved to CDA in 2004 and purchased Wildbeary Huckleberry Products with her sister. She has since retired but the company is still family-owned today. Lori was president of our club from 2011 to 2013.

Lori talked about building the Rotary Harbor House at McEuen Park. The late Ron Ouren, a Rotarian and past-president, worked with the Panhandle Parks Foundation and the City of Coeur d'Alene for the 25 year naming rights for the building at the base of Tubbs Hill. The three local CDA Rotary clubs contributed to the project with our club donating \$35,000, Sunrise Rotary donating \$15,000, and the Thursday Evening Club donating \$500. Between 400,000-500,000 per year walk past the building, which is great visibility for the Rotary wheel on the building with viewing from both the park and lake side. The Harbor House is the home for food concessions from spring to fall, along with restrooms.
