MOMENT OF IMPACT

PAUL ANDERSON was President of our club in 1990-91. He began employment in the region with Washington Water Power in 1967 and moved his way up in the company to Area Manager of North Idaho with Avista Utilities when he retired. Paul served on numerous boards and committees at the local, regional and state levels, including the Idaho Governor's Economic Advisory Council. He was awarded Post Falls Citizen of the Year and also CDA Rotarian of the Year and received the Paul Harris Award.

Paul was a former member of the Lions and Kiwanis Clubs, but it was in Rotary where he put his philanthropic savvy to work. During his presidency, Paul wrote a letter to all Rotarians asking for their support to build something big for the community. This was the beginning of the Rotary Bandshell project that still stands today in the CDA City Park near Independence Point. To help fund the \$50,000+ project, Paul began the Rose Sale during his presidency. With the help of Lucinda Ade and many others, this fantastic fundraiser has allowed our club to sustain a significant fundraiser to support community and international projects for our Rotary club.

SHORT-TERM YOUTH EXCHANGE

Jacklin Gallus joined us today to give a review of her summer Rotary youth exchange in Switzerland. Jacklin is 16 years old and lives in Rathdrum. She was placed with a family in a small town 20 minutes north of Zurich and close to Baden. She noted that most of the buildings in the towns had numbers on them from the 1500-1600s that listed when the buildings were built. She was able to travel and hit guite a bit in the Alos foothills.

Major cultural differences Jacklin experienced were amazing architecture, public drinking fountains everywhere, people rode bikes versus driving, there are skinny roads, not a lot of meat is eaten and there are copious amounts of bread products! Since summer is only 5 weeks in Switzerland, the â&cesisterâ& she lived with will come to the US and complete her exchange in the summer of 2025. Additionally, she was able to travel to Germany to meet the female exchange student that is now living with the Gallus family in Rathdrum for the school year.

PROGRAM

LORA WHALEN introduced the Rotary Friendship Exchange members from Australia. A group of Rotarians from our club visited Adelaide, South Australia in 2019. The exchange was to take place in 2020 with the Aussies, but due to the pandemic, the trip has been years in waiting. David was the District Governor of 9510 in 2021 and began the presentation. He was followed by Mark and Jim, a delightful bunch of Aussies from down under!

A few fun facts about Australia: it became a British settlement in 1778, is the 6th largest country by land area, 26 million population, and 90% of residents live on the coast. Melbourne, not Sydney is the largest city, the Great Barrier Reef includes 2,900 reefs and 900 islands, 91% of the country is covered by native vegetation, and 20 of the world's 25 deadliest snakes live in the country. There are 80 Rotary clubs in District 9510 in South Australia, Adelaide has 1.4 million people, and has the second largest arts festival in the world, Adelaide Fringe.

Rotary events the district supports include: the annual Duck Race, art show, thrift store, second-hand bookshop, food trucks and booths, classic car shows, and the Youth Sailing Challenge.
