MOMENT OF IMPACT

JIM FAUCHER was president of our club from 1992 to 1993. He is a proud alumnus of the University of Idaho with a degree in history and journalism. He moved to Coeur dâ \in [™]Alene in 1984 to serve as director of the (former) Kootenai Medical Center Foundation and vice-president of community development. Under Jimâ \in [™]s tenure, he introduced the community to the Festival of Trees, the hospitalâ \in [™]s annual fundraiser during the Thanksgiving holiday weekend. Jim was the 71st president of our club and helped create the Sunrise Rotary Club, a spin-off of our club, and the second Rotary club to charter in Coeur dâ \in [™]Alene.

NIC Carpentry students helped to build the Rotary Lakeside Bandshell. The inaugural Rose Sale contributed to the project with the theme "Roses Make Great Musicâ€. The project spanned three Rotary presidents from 1990-1993 Paul Anderson, Dave Schreiber, Jim Faucher. In July 1992, there was a celebration to open the bandshell. The total cost was nearly \$200,000.

Stacy Nearing is Steve's oldest daughter who has been on the road for 3.5 months with her family living in a motorhome. She was raised in a family of service, and it has carried through her life. On August 26, 2017, her family was in a rollover accident in Wyoming. Her family survived, except for her oldest daughter, Lilli. The theme of their life became "Live Like Lilliâ€, as she sought out ways to serve others, answering the daily questions: "What did you do for someone todayâ€?

Stacy's husband is embarking on the <u>Black Pearl Project</u>. The Black Pearl Project is an awareness campaign to help others transform their grief into a gift through service.
