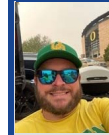
moving from housing instability into housing. The District grant helped fund important supplies and staff time, and on



Thursday afternoon seven of our Club members spent a couple hours helping to assemble personalized bags for children ranging in age from newborn babies all the way to a 17-year old—all of the bags will go to children in need. We learned a lot about Cornerstone Community Housing (providing more than 400 units of affordable housing in the Eugene area) and Bags of Love (provided more than 4,100 personalized bags of support last year), and had a tour of their warehouse (including the shelving we contributed last year). We had a great time matching donated quilts, stuffed animals, toys, clothes, coats and other items with particular requests and then packing it all into a fun bag for younger children or a travel duffel for older children. There was a little friendly competition and a lot of coaching and quality control from the coordinator from Bags of Love. What a great afternoon!

Community Service Committee - Call for Volunteers



Our Rotary Club is kicking off the new year right with great opportunities for living our Rotary values around service. Sign-ups are now open for the great Healthy Snacks for Healthy Minds project with Camas Ridge (more details below).

Call for Volunteers: Healthy Snacks for Hungry Minds

The Rotary Club of Eugene Community Service Committee is supporting a meaningful initiative to ensure that young learners at Camas Ridge Community School are well-nourished and ready to thrive in the classroom. Research shows that full bellies fuel better concentration and learning. The Healthy Snacks for Hungry Minds project aims to address this critical need by providing a consistent supply of healthy snacks to the first-grade level for 2-3 months. The two snacks per day typically come from family and teacher donations and pleas to families to replenish the supply are made on a regular

basis. As a Title 1 school, many families at Camas Ridge face financial challenges, making this effort to reduce that burden even more vital. We'll need some help shopping and packaging the snacks for distribution to classrooms!

Healthy Snacks Volunteer Opportunities:

- **Friday, January 31st – 10:00AM- 12:00PM:** 1-2 volunteers to assist with shopping for healthy snacks at Winco and Costco.
- **Saturday, February 1st - 10:00 AM-12:00 PM:** 3-4 volunteers to help sort and package the snacks into daily/weekly amounts for easy distribution to classrooms at the home of project organizer, Kristina Gribskov.

We're using SignUp to organize the activity. There are different links for the different projects—you just need to click on the link below for this project, enter your email address (You will NOT need to register an account on SignUp), and then sign-up for your spot(s). You will get an automated confirmation and reminders. Note: SignUp does not share your email address with anyone. If you prefer not to use your email address, please contact me and I can sign you up manually.

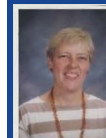

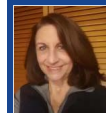

News you can use (and other snippets of useless information)

January 20th is Martin Luther King Jr. Day, This day is a federal holiday honoring civil rights icon Martin Luther King Jr..

January 27th is International Holocaust Remembrance Day. This is a United Nations observance that honors and remembers the tragedy of the Holocaust and the millions of people who lost their lives at the hands of the Nazi government. The 27th was chosen as it marks the anniversary of the date when, in 1945, Soviet troops liberated Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest concentration camp operated by the Nazis.

January 29th is the second new moon after the winter solstice, so, it is the date of Chinese New Year 2025, which is the Year of the Snake. Chinese New Year in China is referred to as the Spring Festival. This day is also the day of the Lunar New Year in most countries. Generally, it is okay to use Lunar New Year to refer to Chinese New Year when speaking to a Chinese person or someone from a culture that doesn't traditionally celebrate Chinese New Year. However, it is best to use Lunar New Year when speaking to individuals with other Asian heritage. If you want to show you

know a bit about the Chinese culture, use Spring Festival ("??") when talking about the actual Chinese New Year, as that is the official term used in China. That also allows you to freely use Lunar New Year for all the other celebrations without any confusion.

February 2nd is Groundhog Day. The special day when a cute little groundhog predicts the weather. Did you know that Punxsutawney Phil sees his shadow 90% of the time? ,,or was it "he sees Bill Murray 90% of the time"?
