Laurie is a proud graduate of the University of Oregon and has lived in Oregon all of her adult life. Before Imagination Library, Laurie spent almost 14 years with the nonprofit SMART Reading as a Program Manager and then Area Director. through providing reading engagement and free books to thousands of Pre-K through 3rd grade children in Benton, Lane, and Linn Counties is one of the highlights of her career. She is grateful to have witnessed the magic shared reading and book ownership can hold for a child, and how committed communities can positively impact outcomes.

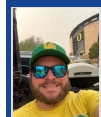

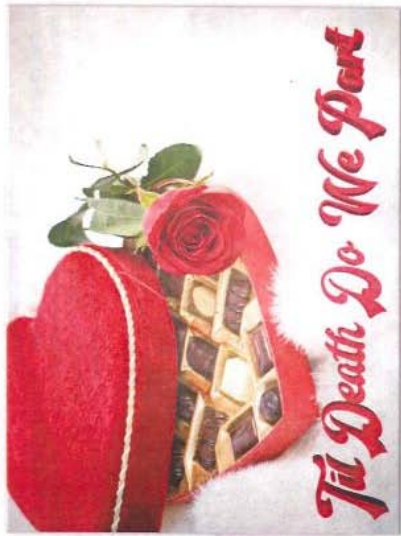

## Rotarians fill Bags of Love for residents of Cornerstone Community Housing



Rotarians and one friend of Rotary helped fill Bags of Love for residents of Cornerstone Community Housing as part of our 204-25 District Grant. This project expanded the Bags of Love/Cornerstone partnership program and the number of youth served. Cornerstone and Bags of Love work together to ensure that Bags of Love containing necessities and comfort items such as clothing, toiletries, toys, books, school supplies and a handmade quilt are delivered to each child moving from housing instability into housing. The District grant helped fund important supplies and staff time, and on Thursday afternoon seven of our Club members spent a couple hours helping to assemble personalized bags for children ranging in age from newborn babies all the way to a 17-year old—all of the bags will go to children in need. We learned a lot about Cornerstone Community Housing (providing more than 400 units of affordable housing in the Eugene area) and Bags of Love (provided more than 4,100 personalized bags of support last



year), and had a tour of their warehouse (including the shelving we contributed last year). We had a great time matching donated quilts, stuffed animals, toys, clothes, coats and other items with particular requests and then packing it all into a fun bag for younger children or a travel duffel for older children. There was a little friendly competition and a lot of coaching and quality control from the coordinator from Bags of Love. What a great afternoon! Thanks to members Karen Scheeland, Andy Vobora, Bart Poston, Mark Hewitt, Karen Gaffney and Jerry Whitman Harris for volunteering.

Thank you for your participation in our community service projects--it feels good to do good!

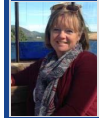

## Rotary Club of Eugene Mentorship Program



Many of you recall, and a goodly number of you participated in, our Club's UO Rotaract Mentorship Program prior to Covid. Due to the pandemic, the mentorship program was placed on extended hiatus. Now, at the request of the current cohort of Rotaract members at the UO (photo at left), we are bringing this great program back! We are looking to you to help restart the program by volunteering to be a one-on-one mentor to a Rotaractor currently attending the UO.

The basics of the program are simple: our Club recruits willing mentors from our members. We match up our available mentors with a student who has career aspirations within the scope of the mentor's expertise. We then ask mentor and mentee to schedule a meeting for introductions and a chat about how the two of you want to interact. Most of our previous mentors ended up agreeing to meet for an hour or so at or near the U over coffee or lunch to just talk about how school and life is progressing, what difficulties the student may be working through, and/or whatever else comes to mind. The goal is to offer stability, advice when asked, act as a sounding board, and generally be there for the student if needed. Meetings generally happened once or twice a month but are totally up to you and your student.

I also need to know what profession(s) you have expertise in. You will not regret it!

## News you can use (and other snippets of useless information)

**January 20th is Martin Luther King Jr. Day.** This day is a federal holiday honoring civil rights icon Martin Luther King Jr..

**January 27th is International Holocaust Remembrance Day.** This is a United Nations observance that honors and remembers the tragedy of the Holocaust and the millions of people who lost their lives at the hands of the Nazi government. The 27th was chosen as it marks the anniversary of the date when, in 1945, Soviet troops liberated Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest concentration camp operated by the Nazis.

**January 29th is the second new moon after the winter solstice, so, it is the date of Chinese New Year 2025, which is the Year of the Snake.** Chinese New Year in China is referred to as the Spring Festival. This day is also the day of the Lunar New Year in most countries. Generally, it is okay to use Lunar New Year to refer to Chinese New Year when speaking to a Chinese person or someone from a culture that doesn't traditionally celebrate Chinese New Year. However, it is best to use Lunar New Year when speaking to individuals with other Asian heritage. If you want to show you know a bit about the Chinese culture, use Spring Festival when talking about the actual Chinese New Year, as that is the official term used in China. That also allows you to freely use Lunar New Year for all the other celebrations without any confusion.

**February 2nd is Groundhog Day.** The special day when a cute little groundhog predicts the weather. Did you know that Punxsutawney Phil sees his shadow 90% of the time? ..,or was it "he sees Bill Murray 90% of the time"?

**February 13th is Murder Mystery Day** for the **Rotary Club of Eugene**. Join in the fun as you solve the mystery:
