February 27th is Anosmia Awareness Day. This day is intended to bring attention to a condition causing a loss of smell. Of all our senses, smell perhaps is taken for granted more than any other. There are many causes of short tern Anosmia., for example; upper respiratory or sinus/nasal infections or diseases like colds, allergies or Birthdays Covid. However, other conditions cause permanent or long-term loss of the sense of smell. When anosmia symptoms are prolonged or lifelong, many anosmics do not get to enjoy the flavor of foods, the scent of an infant or use their sense of smell as an early warning system for danger.

February 28th is the first day of Ramadan in 2025. Ramadan occurs on the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. It is during this month that Muslims believe the first verses of the Quran - Islam's holy book - were revealed to the Prophet Muhammad. During Ramadan, Muslims are required to fast during each day. The daily fast is ended at sunset each night during Ramadan with a festive meal called an iftar. Muslims are also called to give to charity, to show kindness and patience, and to strengthen their relationship with God during Ramadan. Eid al-Fitr also known as, the 'festival of breaking the fast' is a joyous occasion that marks the end of Ramadan,




