

#### March 11 Meeting - Common Man for Ukraine: Now More Than Ever with Susan Mathison



For three years, American nonprofit Common Man for Ukraine, a project of the Plymouth (NH) Rotary Foundation, has partnered with Polish and Ukrainian Rotarians to supply humanitarian aid and trauma counseling programs to Ukrainian children of war – delivering more than 4 million pounds of food, sleeping bags, and generators directly into the hands of those who need help most. Inspired by Rotary's "Service above Self", the organization's co-founders have joined monthly relief convoys to Ukrainian villages throughout Ukraine and on the front lines 12 times and counting. Common Man for Ukraine turns its work into first hand witnesses of both the war's devastating impact and the power of Rotary and of every individual to make a difference to the children of war. The group plans to return to Ukraine for a 13th humanitarian trip in March.

About Susan:

Susan Mathison is currently based in Plymouth, New Hampshire. She is one of four co-founders of the nonprofit Common Man

for Ukraine – a special initiative of the Plymouth Rotary Foundation. Formerly with the USDA Forest Service, Mathison, a mother herself, feels the call to serve and support traumatized Ukrainian children of war now more than ever. To help ease the transition to a totally new country when they have often left their country with little but the clothes on their backs, the Coalition provides families with kits that help them set up their new homes.

Our club is supporting the Coalition's latest refugees to get settled by providing items for bedroom and kitchen kits. The project was developed by member Jennifer Geller and made possible with \$1000 from your Club's Community Service Committee and Club volunteers. This all occurred on February 22nd when Jennifer, Karen Gaffney and Victoria Whitman Harris went on a 'shopping spree for good'. The whites, kitchen tools and household goods were delivered to the Coalition afterward and will be delivered to newly arrived refugee families soon.

March 13/14 Total Lunar Eclipse. Clear skies willing, a total lunar eclipse will be visible in Eugene (and the entire United States). The eclipse starts at 8:57 pm on Thursday March 13 when the moon is in the east-southeast sky at 20degrees above the horizon, reaches the full eclipse maximum at 11:58 pm in the south-southeast at 45 deg, and ends at 3:00 am in the south-southwest at 40 degrees above the horizon on March 14.

**March 20 is the Vernal Equinox.** The Vernal equinox is the first day of <u>spring</u> in the <u>Northern Hemisphere</u> and the start of <u>fall</u> in the <u>Southern Hemisphere</u>, by <u>astronomical definitions</u>. Also National Ravioli Day - a day near and dear to your humble editor's heart (and stomach).

March 23 is National Puppy Day. Observed each year on March 23rd, National Puppy Day celebrates the unconditional love and affection puppies bring to our lives. 
