From supporting HIV/AIDS orphans through music in Uganda to creating career pathways for unemployed youth through traditional music and dance, to leading arts-based education initiatives globally, he has used music to uplift individuals and strengthen communities.

Julius will highlight how his work aligns with Rotary's Seven Areas of Focus, particularly in education, peacebuilding, economic development, and health initiatives. He will explore how music serves as a powerful tool for connection, empowerment, and positive change, fostering understanding across cultures. His presentation shares how music education can bridge cultures, transform lives, and create lasting impacts in communities worldwide.

About Julius:

Julius Kyakuwa is a music educator and scholar with extensive experience in Uganda, South Africa, and the United States. He earned his doctorate from Louisiana State University and holds a Bachelor of Music (Honors) and Master of Music, cum laude, in Music Education from the University of Pretoria, South Africa. His work focuses on expanding culturally inclusive teaching practices and creating meaningful musical experiences for diverse learners. He has led global workshops on arts integration, multicultural music education, and culturally responsive teaching and has taught at universities across the U.S., Africa, and Brazil. At The University of Kansas (KU), he introduced a graduate course on intercultural awareness education and received a faculty award for his innovative approach to teaching and mentorship.

Dr. Kyakuwa's research focuses on arts integration, music teacher preparation, and broadening access to quality music education. He has presented at major conferences, including the International Society for Music Education (ISME), the Pan African Society of Musical Arts Education, and the American Education Research Association (AERA), and has published in respected academic journals. A Rotarian, he embodies the motto "Service Above Self", using music as a bridge to connect communities, empower individuals, and inspire positive change worldwide.



March 23 is National Puppy Day. Observed each year on March 23rd, National Puppy Day celebrates the unconditional love and affection puppies bring to our lives. The day also brings awareness to the need for care of and homes for orphaned pups as well as to educate people about the horrors of puppy mills across the country. Puppies are a big responsibility. Be sure to consider everything involved and adopt from a shelter. This day is also known locally as Victoria's Day.

April 5th is National Deep Dish Pizza Day. This day gives pizza lovers a day to celebrate one of America's favorite varieties of pizza and bow down to the home of deep dish pizza - Chicago! Detroit-style, New York-style? Fogeddaboutit! All fugazis! Windy City deep dish will blow your socks off....and we don't put no stinkin' cheddar cheese on our pizza.

April 7th is National Beer Day. This day recognizes the world's most widely consumed alcoholic beverage. Following water and tea, it is the third most popular drink overall. At that time, the filing deadline was March 1. In 1918 the deadline was changed to March 15, and then in 1955, for the most recent change, the filing deadline was moved to April 15th. Following the ratification of the U.S. Constitution, Benjamin Franklin wrote in a letter: "Our new Constitution is now established, everything seems to promise it will be durable; but, in this world, nothing is certain except death and taxes."
