

## **April 1st Meeting - Lane Community College Update**



This week Grant Matthews will welcome us to the new Health Professions Building at Lane Community College! Grant is the Associate Vice President for Career Technical Education and Workforce Development at Lane Community College (LCC) in Eugene, Oregon. Grant will tell us about the new Health Professions Building that was completed for occupation May 2024. The Health Professions Building as built to house the following instructional programs and services: Medical Assistant Program; Emergency Medical Services Program; Dental Assistant and Dental Hygienist Programs; General Student Support offices, including flexible classroom seating of over 100; Faculty Offices; and Administrative Support services. There will be a brief tour of the Health Professions building.

A tour of the new Industry and Trades Education Center (ITEC) building next door will also be offered to those interested, This brand-new facility focuses on workforce development and a long-term goal to bolster Oregon's economic growth. The ITEC is a 55,353-square-foot building with three floors of space for

instruction across industries such as manufacturing and construction technologies; unmanned aircraft systems; and select apprenticeship programs. The innovative mass timber and steel hybrid design will complement the programs offered, using exposed steel beams and Freres Engineered Wood's Mass Ply Panels (MPP) as its primary structural components. The ITEC building opened Thanksgiving of 2024 and will host its first classes in LCC's Winter 2025 term.

### About Grant:

In his current role at LCC, Grant oversees the School of Professional Technical Careers which includes allied health education, business, technology, trades, the Lane Aviation Academy, high school connection initiatives, integrated education and training initiatives, small business development support, cooperative education and internships, and Carl D. Perkins funding. Grant has also held the position of Dean for Health Profession, Health, and Physical Education, Career Pathways, Adult Basic Education, and Academic Learning Skills at LCC. Prior to LCC, he served as an Assistant Dean at Moraine Valley Community College in Palos Hills, Illinois and a Director at Chemeketa Community College in Salem, Oregon. Grant is an experienced educator and education leader with a deep passion for students and the potential they bring for their own future. His passion for student success translates to dedication in his work and research. He holds an MPA in Higher Education Leadership from Portland State University and doctoral coursework in Community College Leadership at Oregon State University.

**April 5th is National Deep Dish Pizza Day.** This day gives pizza lovers a day to celebrate one of America's favorite varieties of pizza and bow down to the home of deep dish pizza - Chicago! **April 7th is National Beer Day.** This day recognizes the world's most widely consumed alcoholic beverage. Following water and tea, it is the third most popular drink overall. At that time, the filing deadline was March 1. In 1918 the deadline was changed to March 15, and then in 1955, for the most recent change, the filing deadline was moved to April 15th. The day has come to be known as Tax Day. Following the ratification of the U.S. Constitution, Benjamin Franklin wrote in a letter: "Our new Constitution is now established, everything seems to promise it will be durable; but, in this world, nothing is certain except death and taxes."

April 17th is National Haiku Poetry Day. A poetry day. Seems weird at first but try it. You will be surprised.

April 18th is National Poem in Your Pocket Day. See April 17th.
