



Each of the committee chairs presented their accomplishments during the year which met **President Kellie's** goals:



➤ Jean Herschede (chair, Community Services Committee) highlighted how the community services worked with and without other committees to bring forth various accomplishments. Major accomplishments include providing National Graphic books to Geyserville Elementary Schools, getting the District grant for Audubon Canyon Ranch and a mental health clinic in a middle school in an indigenous community in Guatemala as well as three scholarships for middle school students. Her committee worked with the Environment Committee to work with Healdsburg Garden Club on the Healdsburg rose garden.

Cathy King (chair, Youth Services) highlighted work with Interact club at Healdsburg High School including Peace Pole installation and dedication. A second Peace Poll was installed at Geyserville Elementary School. She also highlighted the scholarship program which Andy Elkind is enhancing to the "next level." Additional accomplishments included doing the Adulting 101 for



the seniors at Healdsburg High school and sponsoring and helping at the RYLA camp.

Norm Fujita (chair, Environment Committee) highlighted the overall club's help with the environmental project which led to our club receiving the District 5130 Governor's Environmental Challenge Award. The significant projects included our yearly cleanup of Highway 101 off ramps and on ramps led by Nita parker, zero waste lunches helped



by **Barbara Rosen**, revitalizing the garden at Healdsburg Elementary School primarily due to our club grant given to School Garden Networks which includes sending vegetables grown in the garden home with students, District 5130 Arundo donax removal project with the Russian Riverkeeper, and having a booth at the Second Earth Day Climate Fest on the concern of pollinator loss in the world.

- Dick Cochran (Rotary Youth Exchange) mentioned that Don Mitchell and Barbara Oddone have joined him to make the Rotary Youth Exchange program more active. He updated its current status.
- Kellie Larson summarized the work by the International Committee in Devin Drew's absence due to a vacation. The major accomplishments include the work in Guatemala mentioned above by Jean Herschede, clean water distribution project in in Leogane, Haiti through the Rotary International's HANWASH program, continuing work in a community garden in Merida, Mexico, and help with emergency power equipment, first aid kits and youth mental health services in Zaporizhzhia and Cherkasy, Ukraine.



➤ **Dick Cochran** (chair, Rotary Foundation) announced that our club has so far donated \$6,492 to annual fund which is mostly to the Paul Harris Society. He also mentioned that our club via the Green Hair Committee was able to raise so far, \$20,917 as of June 18, 2024. We are the number one club in District 5130 to raise money for Polio Plus.



> **Don Mitchell** (chair of Program Committee) thanked the club members for helping to provide ideas speakers for the club meetings.

- Emily Martin (chair of Public Relations) announced our Instagram followers are up to 234. The use of social media for club news dissemination is more robust. She thanked the club for ideas and Rick Tang for all the photos.
- John Hazlett (filling in for John Avakian who is chair of Club Services) summarized the activities for the year which included Tuesday in the Plaza, Social at Barbara Oddone's home, Dinners for Eight, Halloween Party, Holiday Party, Valentine's Day Lunch, Evening Travel Photo Log, Martini's and Pizza, FFA Parade and Debunking Party. John Hazlett recognized Jerry Ogden for spearheading the Rose Garden Memorial Bench project.





- President Kellie, filling in for Tricia Fichtner, chair of the membership committee, announced that we have 64 members and our average age has come down from age 67 to 64. Female member percentage is 20%.
- Kellie thanked also George Heath for continuously doing the Voice of the Vineyards, Dick Bertepelle for being the webmaster and Rick Tang for all his photography.
