PROGRAM

District Governor Jim O'Grady

Moving on to his background: He's been a Rotarian for 20 years, twice was president of Rotary Club of Petaluma Valley, his wife Joanne is from Healdsburg and his 2 little granddaughters were "stunned" to know that he was District Governor by saying "A DG you be" and "What's a DG?"

This Rotary International theme is "The MAGIC of Rotary." There are many interpretations of this. Especially the term "magic" can mean that "things disappear," as he influenced a fabric to disappear and reappear, before our eyes. Magic can definitely influence others. And that's what Rotary does in the World, it influences and changes lives.

To DG Jim, Rotary means FRIENDSHIP...love...belonging...connection to elderly or children or a Thanksgiving meal. Helen Keller quote about bringing light to the world. And to Rotarians, we bring joy and beauty of life through service. To him, Rotary is building better friendships (BBF)

Then his presentation became interactive. He asked 10-12 questions that not only were relevant but revealing: WHAT HAPPENED FIRST?

- When did Rotary membership exceed \$1Million? 1985
- When were women admitted to Rotary? 1987
- O When was the Four Way Test adopted? 1932
- o When did the Rotary Youth Exchange Program start? 1927
- What did Bob Hope and Walt Disney have in common?
 Answer: Not attended Rotary, nor Rotarians, nor Goofy. But each were Honorary Members.
- What does "Plus" mean in PolioPlus? Yes, it would increase the number of vaccinations, but it would dramatically increase the number of vaccinations for 5 diseases: Measles, Tuberculosis, Diphtheria, Whooping Cough, and Tetanus.

For a moment, DG Jim focused on the concept of "Every Rotarian, Every Year" for the 46 Clubs in District 5130. Currently, members average \$25 to the Rotary Foundation, which is only about half of the membership now. He wants to challenge Rotarians to improve their personal pattern.

Then the District Governor asked us, how far is it FROM CHICAGO to the spot where the Four Way Test was displayed? Name the miles or the location.

ANSWER: Astronaut Buzz Aldrin (Rotary Club of Spring Lake-Brielle) was lunar modular pilot of Apollo 11 in 1969 and was the second (after Neil Armstrong) to walk on the Moon and was first to place the Four Way Test there.

And to close this entertaining and educational program, DG Jim played his accordion, so we could guess from what country the tune came, and he could tell us about projects in that country. Poland – Warsaw peace project. Greece – Creating Friendship for Peace (CFP). Italy – projects in agriculture & business. France – Fellowship for Francophonie. (Those who come together to speak French). DG Jim is a member of a musician fellowship. Czeck



after WWII, Rotary was illegal for 4 decades, and in 1990, Prague established 3. Mexico –
 Paul Harris planted trees on 5 Continents and established 38 Clubs. Great Britain – peace projects from Liverpool to Sweden. The USA is starting to create friendship projects in Egypt and Peru.

"
