TODAY'S PROGRAM: EXPLORING SONOMA COUNTY'S NATURAL TREASURE: LAGUNA DE SANTA ROSA



President Jim introduced presenter Anne Morkill, Executive Director of the Laguna de Santa Rosa Foundation. Anne explained that the foundation stewards' habitats and inspires people to foster connection and contribute to a healthy environment throughout the Laguna de Santa Rosa watershed, which runs from the Mayacamas westerly through Santa Rosa and Rohnert Park.

Challenges to the health of the wildlife of the Santa Rosa Plain include land use changes, flood control, sediment, water quality, invasive species and climate change. Anne had maps showing the land use change from 1877 to today. The headwaters for the Laguna de Santa Rosa are a plain in Cotati. The watershed is fed by Windsor Creek, Mark West Creek, Santa Rosa Creek and Upper Laguna de Santa Rosa. Flood control impacts water flow in the

Laguna de Santa Rosa, sometimes reducing it to separate lakes. Sediment from all sources clogs up the Laguna. The Foundation is actively managing sediment to reduce the impact.

The Foundation impacts the watershed by restoration and conservation projects, establishing Laguna learning schools and the Laguna Environmental Center located in Santa Rosa. See website at http://lagunafoundation.org/learning_overview.html. The Foundation has also worked with local farms to support conservation easements to protect the land from development. The Foundation sponsors special projects such as Hood Mountain Regional Park, Cunningham Marsh, Vine Hill Preserve, Pitkin Marsh Preserve and Shone Farm Forest. The Foundation also operates Camp Tule to help children appreciate nature and the environment. Other activities include community education walks, Laguna Stewards, Garden and Nursery Volunteers, art shows, service projects and more – visit the website at www.lagunadesantarosa.org.
