

#### TODAY'S PROGRAM

Sarah Vantrease, Public Services Manager of the Sonoma County Library, shared with the Rotary how the Sonoma County Library is leveraging its unique assets, resources, and expertise to meet evolving community needs.

Over 200,000 people in Sonoma County have library cards. Do you have yours? In the last 12 months there were almost 1.5 million visits and 4.5 million checkouts. Sonoma County has 12 full-

Service locations that are open 7 days a week. Thanks to the library sales tax



measure, for the last seven years, it has been able to increase hours of operations by 40%. Other improvements include mobile services that reach the coast and smaller communities, archives of special items and local history collections. Also, soon people will be able to pick up books at lockers during outside library hours.

Closer to home, for the first year since it was built in 1988, the Healdsburg Library will undergo significant interior renovations to modernize the building for the public. In addition to new furniture & finishes, major upgrades to the children's and teen space areas will be made. Upgrades will include the study pod and ADA improvements including accessible restrooms. The renovation will include a book sorting system that improves turnaround time for getting materials back on the shelf as well as reduce ergonomic strain on staff. The cost is approximately \$2.4 million dollars. Also, thanks to the support of the Friends of the Healdsburg Library nonprofit group, it is adding special features to the project, like new windows with reading benches in the children's area.

The Sonoma County library is also making it easier to getting library cards, eliminating overdue fines, providing services that are both in Spanish & English. They have available live interpretation in over 100 languages including ASL through an online & telephone relay system.

When it comes to technology, one of the library's most popular services are wifi hotspots, Chrome kits to borrow – laptops and PCs in the library and free copying and printing. They have a Playback Memory Lab, you can digitize old photos, slides, VHS tapes, sound studio (podcast, video editing), and lending of professional AV equipment like cameras, green screens. They provide large and small meeting spaces. The Library reaches out to various communities such as embedding librarians at the jail and juvenile hall. During the summer, in partnership with Redwood Empire Food Bank, they even serve free lunches at seven locations to all kids and teens.

The Sonoma County Library is for everyone. They provide services and programs from Pre-K to Adults. Scope includes access to training to grow personally and professionally.
