Marcus Shelby, Healdsburg Jazz Artistic Director

Marcus has been the Artistic Director for Healdsburg Jazz for about four years. His resume is quite remarkable, and too long for inclusion here. It is recommended one should Google Marcus Shelby for a wonderful review of his work, past and present. In our meeting, Marcus spent quality time educating our members about



the music and history of Duke Ellington. We learned about Duke Ellington's early years and struggles for recognition, culminating in his later years being recognized as the most influential and important band leader and composer in the world of jazz. Our club was enlightened with several of Duke's composition, and we heard the following, all preceded by Marcus' description of when and why these particular compositions were released:

· Soda Fountain Rag: 1915

· Black & Tan: 1927

· It Don't Mean A Thing If It Ain't Got The Swing: 1931

· Raincheck: 1944

· Come Sunday: which Marcus played for us, with his imposing bass play having mesmerized our members

We were saddened that his time was up! Someone later said, "We could have listened to Marcus all afternoon—a terrific program!"
