

PROGRAM Sept 16

Potter Valley Project - David Taber



Mr. Taber gave us a very detailed account of the Potter Valley Project that is operated by PG&E and will be ending the 100-year power plant operations in 2028. The impact will be less water coming down the Russian River to meet the needs of most of the towns and rural agricultural areas in the Russian River watershed. The water currently going to Alexander Valley, Cloverdale, Potter Valley and Northern Sonoma County will be dramatically

reduced. This very complex situation is getting some serious attention my all the cities, counties, water districts, and general public who have deeded water rights to their properties. Time is short for infrastructure retooling and/or resource planning given that the water currently coming from the Eel River pipeline to the power plant will be suspended in 2028. All homeowners are encouraged to review their water rights documentation if they are on a well or live in a city that has yet to address the impacts facing their towns.

There is many recourses on the Internet and every city in Northern Sonoma is or will be soon, focused on this major problem.
