

PROGRAM--Rhoda Visits Healdsburg

Don Anderson came across his grandmother Rhoda Carey's diaries when he and Julia were moving homes from Berkeley to Healdsburg. Among the 17 volumes he found some very interesting travel entries including a multi month trip from her home in Noblesville, IN to stay with her niece - a new mother - in Healdsburg, CA, 1908.





Rhoda's nephew-in-law was known - in the time of her visit - as the Buggy Man. He operated a business adjacent to the Farmers and Mechanics Bank.





The presentation touched on many interesting topics including motivations for Greek revival architecture such as the subsequent Farmers and Mechanics Bank building that still stands at Plaza and Center streets. Also included was an overview of the arrival of early motorcars in Healdsburg.

As the presentation wrapped up, a club member mentioned the Fans of Ancient Road Transportation - who

operate motorcars from the era of Rhoda's visit - will be touring the county on Tuesday Oct 15th with a <u>planned event</u> on the Healdsburg Plaza.
