PROGRAM

At only approximately 30 years of age, Alex Saravich has an impressive resume, including 2023 Sommelier of the year. She came to her current vocation by starting as a chef. She realized that the important aspects of food, flavor, texture were also important in wine. She started her wine training in college and was able to attend the German Sommelier school. She said that if one is interested in wine it is very valuable to get some education, either in an in person class or taking one on line, and very helpful to find a study group to be part of. She said as Sommelier it is important not to give the diner too many choices. She starts with two and can take direction from there if needed. It is also important that the Sommelier have restaurant training as well as wine knowledge. To the question about bringing your own bottle to a restaurant she said that if the restaurant has a Sommelier and extensive wine list, it really makes sense to take advantage of the service being offered. She said if, in that situation, you have a bottle that's very special to you and is not on the wine list then it's ok. In a restaurant with an ordinary wine list, it's fine as long as the wine is not on the restaurant's list.
