Thor has taught for 24 years; Karina is a recent Masters Program graduate. MBA is part of Big Picture Learning which has 275 schools in the US. The program emphasizes Learning Through Interests and places students in situations outside the classroom where they can pursue career goals, passions, and community involvement with mentors.
