TODAY'S PROGRAM



Jeff Kay, city manager of Healdsburg, gave an update on all the major current issues. He announced that the three incumbent city council members, David Hagele, Ariel Kelley and Ron Edwards won the election. The other major issues that were discussed included the defeat of Measure O, the city budget, SMART, new north/south bike path, naming of the new park near Montage, and status of the Climate Mobilization

Strategy.

Some of the highlights were:

- Considerations of options with regards what to do in the future with the defeat of Measure O
- Healdsburg City has a two-year stable budge so far. It has \$44 million capital projects
- The purple pipe to water landscape of city parks and schools to be completed in about a year
- The New fire station across from Enso Village was built and is now functional
- The final name of the new park also across the street from Enso Village has not been decided
- The City is working to decrease greenhouse gas emissions by buying EV and increasing EV charging stations in various parts of the city to stimulate resident converting to EVs, switching to heat pumps for heating and air conditioning in city buildings
- SMART train now projected to connect to Healdsburg by end of 2028
- Bike lane to extend south over the Russian River along a new bridge for SMART and to the north to Enso Village. The northern extension is to be finished by end of 2025

• Public hearing will start for establishing districts for city council elections
