The once homeless club now has a reliable home base.

He then entertained and educated us about Rotary through a clever Accordian-accompanied trivia contest.

We learned:

When Rotary reached the one million member mark;
When the first Rotary Youth Exchange occurred;
That Bob Hope and Walt Disney were "honorary Rotarians;"
What the "Plus" means in the Rotary Plus initiative...it led to putting the focus on battling the many other childhood infectious diseases in the world, such as TB, measles, diptheria, whooping cough and others.
About the Every Rotarian Every Year initiative whereby we are encouraged to donate at least \$25 a year to the foundations;
The farthest distance that the Four Way Test was displayed was on the surface of the moon by astronaut Buzz Aldrin.

Then we were given an around-the-world tour via the Accordian by identifying the country where various songs originated.
