PROGRAM

The program was about Early Alert Canines presented by Alysia Santos. She had a beautiful golden lab with her. First it is important for all of us to understand that a service dog has a lifesaving job to do. They have full access to anywhere their person goes. Please do not try to engage these dogs, they are working. This is quite different from an emotional support dog and completely different from a pet. Please do not try to misrepresent your pet (no matter how much you love them) as working dogs. They are not!

The Early Alert Canines are trained to work for individuals who are Type 1 insulin dependent diabetics. Dogs have 40% more scent receptors in their brains than we do. Type 1 diabetics have sudden crashes in their blood sugars which can result in confusion, coma and death. These dogs are trained to alert individuals or in the case of babies or young children their caregivers so corrective lifesaving action can be taken.
