PROGRAM

Alison Simon, PhD, PMP, AICP presented a discussion on the future of Rail in the climate change world. Dr. Simon has worked in the transportation industry for over 30 years, the last 10 of which have been with Amtrak. While with Amtrak, Dr. Simon held several roles in Washington DC including buying and designing new train sets and helping executives think through needed change. The last two years have been in California as Amtrak's liaison with the state. She has incorporated sustainability into her work for the years culminating in a sustainability award from the Association of American Railroads. Dr. Simon has a master's and Ph.D. in Urban Planning which results in big picture thinking, often missing in the transportation industry. When such thinking is combined with her sustainability expertise, the result is what we heard about today.

Climate change is so important and not a competitive form of transportation. 35% of carbon pollution is mostly from cars. Electric train cars are good but only for short distance. Rail transportation is not a competitive form of transportation today because they are not able to take over the 100-500 mile travel slack. The rail tracks are owned by freight railroads and difficult to accommodate passenger trains. Amtrak began on 5-1-1971. All passenger rails are subsidized by the government. The freight trains take precedence over the passenger trains. There are only two places in the country where Amtrak owns the rail and, in that instance, may run 5 trains a day.

Expansion now is the first since Richard Nixon started it in 1970. People need to ride the train and think about the climate change and the most sustainable way to travel. They are not able to put the passenger trains on the freight lines because they need to be electric.

Following the presentation many thoughtful questions were asked by the attendees in the audience.

Dr. Simon was presented with a thank you gift to honor the Trinity Center.
