PROGRAM

Our speaker was Dr. Maureen Stevenson, chief administrative officer of ambulatory services and population health of John Muir Health Physician Practices. The John Muir Health system is comprised of 4 hospitals, Walnut Creek, Concord, Brentwood, and a partner with San Ramon. There are 1,000 physicians. John Muir can't hire the physicians, state law, so the physicians have a medical group which contracts with John Muir. There is a shortage of physicians since 2020, and John Muir is working to hire more. John Muir has 6,400 employees, and is a nonprofit with 2.3 million dollars in revenue. 100% over their costs goes back to the

community. It is the largest employer in Contra Costa County, and has been here over 90 years. It also has outpatient facilities in Walnut Creek, Pleasanton, Berkeley, Concord, San Ramon, and Brentwood. The goal is to keep care close so patients don't have to travel to get care. The goal is also to keep costs down, as many patients can't afford insurance, and Medicare and Medi-Cal don't cover all expenses. John Muir is also trying to be innovative. They have opened a new cancer center, new cardiac program, and the new behavior health care center has in and outpatient facilities, which is very unusual. The behavior

health program has 10% of the pediatric beds in the state, and has acute psychiatric care.

The new cancer center, the Behring Pavilion and the Ken and Jean Hofmann Cancer Center, were all built on donations totaling \$100,000,000.

John Muir is working on a new Center for Older Adult Health. They are especially concerned with care to decrease hospitalizations. They will have a Navigator group to help people stay healthier so they are not hospitalized, help with transition from hospital to home, give them rides to doctors, help if they cannot afford medications, health classes, and access to a geriatric clinic. They will have home visit programs, palliative care, help with advance care planning, while patients remain with their PCD (Primary Care Doctor). All this costs money. And John Muir Health is mandated to retrofit all their facilities for earthquake protection.

John Muir is using Ai. It is using Ai on eCart, which electronically helps with cardiac arrest and triage and Viz: AI, which has stroke detectors and mobile alerts. My Chart and InBasket help doctors to keep up with patient information more easily. John Muir has extensive security systems so patients' data is not compromised while using Ai.

The meeting adjourned at 1:30 p.m.
