**Today's program:** Assistant Professor Jonathan Schofield: Assistive robotics, rehabilitation engineering, neural-integrated prosthetic limbs

Today we had an amazing and very interesting speaker, Professor Jonathan Schofield from the Department of Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering at UC Davis.

I was so engrossed in his talk; I must apologize that I did not take enough notes to express how important his research and the project he and his team are working on. He leads a team that is helping children and adults born without a hand or have lost their hand, providing them with a prosthetic that allows them the ability to live a fuller life. They are developing a prosthetic that has the dexterity that mimics our real hand. What has been available are prosthetics that have harnesses that go over the shoulder, and the hand has a claw or pinch style. The old styles did not allow the patient the freedom to have some sense of normalcy with that limb. They are working on

how copy the muscles activity in the forearm of the good hand and transfer that to the effected arm. The body and mind are operating the hand. The sample of the hand and the tiny electro sensor that was passed around was impressive as it had individual fingers and would allow the patient to lead a more normal life. His teams long term goal is to develop something

similar on lower limbs and children with Cerebral Palsy.
