Enterprise Institute



Program for the Day - Jestin Johnson

Isaac Kos-Read introduced Jestin Johnson, city administrator of the City of Oakland. Mr. Johnson served in government positions in Athens-Clarke County, Georgia and Bisbee and Tucson, Arizona. He is a veteran of the U.S. Air Force and a former Rotary Club member.

The City Administrator's office has three assistant and two deputy city administrators. Its mission is to support the mayor, city council, and community. A major challenge is to close the \$129 million budget deficit. The City is looking to neighboring jurisdictions for help in solving the budget issue. Although the City has "browned out" five fire stations, it sent 12 firefighters to assist in fighting the Los Angeles fires. Mr. Johnson is currently working to onboard the newly elected council members. He had these responses to audience questions:

- Oakland Police have increased patrols at Frank Ogawa Plaza to improve safety
- The City is engaging in a meet and confer process with labor so that city hall employees return to inperson work four days per week
- The City is waiting for Alameda County to take action with regard to the Oakland Coliseum.
