Be bottled at exactly 100 proof and be produced under U.S. government supervision.

Linda Vasquez, Pacific Gives

We had two speakers representing Pacific today. The first was **Linda Vasquez**, Assistant Director for Alumni Relations. She is a dedicated professional with a decade of experience at the University of the Pacific, where she currently serves as Assistant Director for Alumni Engagement and the Pacific Gives Ambassador Liaison. She spent 7.5 years with Athletics before transitioning to Alumni Relations for the past 1.5 years. A native of Stockton, Linda has a strong background in community engagement, having worked with Stockton Thunder for 8 years and actively volunteering with veterans in the community. Her commitment to service extends to her time on the United Way Board, where she contributed to impactful local initiatives.
