Shannon Hurles stood and said they are officially finished with their remodeled 100 year old home in Wallace. She said they have tarantulas, snakes, goats, ducks










Dick McClure begins the story

President Bill introduced our versatile speaker. Dick McClure. His topic today was, "Restoration from Start to Finish." He started by saying three years ago he bought a car that was so far gone, rusted out, missing parts and one foot from being crushed for scrap, it posed a unique challenge to him. Could he restore this in 11 months and participate in the Quail **Sports Motor Gathering in Monterey?** The car is a 1958 Alfa Romeo Giulietta Bertone Sprint Coupe with a twin overhead cam. Dick has a shop in Stockton, he calls it his "Taj Ma Garage" and does most things himself. As you can see, rust rules and there are holes everywhere. It took 5 days to cut out all the rust. He then had the car sand blasted. He then had to reinforce the body. With the trunk and floors rusted out, he hand made and welded new metal in place. A real Rusteration! The car has no frame so every panel has to line up perfectly. He actually found a side panel, and bought a lot of Bondo to perfect it for paint. He used after market parts if he couldn't find original. Parts came from the US, Italy, Taiwan, and China. He then prefit everything prior to painting. The color he picked, Rustoleum Royal Blue! He got the seats from a car catalogue and the fabric on the door panels was \$9.99 at Fabricland.

Side note about the paint. He had talked to an Alfa Romeo car club after everything and the members asked him if the color was Alfa Rosso (Blue), Alfa Blue, Anodized Blue Metallic, Moonlight Blue Metallic, Vesuvio Blue Metallic, or Vulcano Blue Metallic? He enjoyed responding to these Alfa Elites, Royal Rustoleum Blue!

He also was cruising around Monterey and saw his friend Wayne Carini come out of a hotel. Carini spotted the car and he and his friend came over to check it out. After being introduced to the woman in sweats she said her name was Renee. Dick asked her Renee with one E or two? She said two, if not I would be a man!
