Tuesday, December 17th we were at the Hilton. I chose the vegetarian lunch and had a perfect salad with balsamic dressing, again.

At 12:24 **Andy Chesley** rang the bell, informing us that we have him today, with **Bill McDonald** having health issues. Later in the week this email from Bill was sent out: It's been a very difficult couple of months for me physically, and I'm reporting now that I won't be coming back to Rotary for at least a couple more months. I want to thank everyone for their well-wishes, thoughts, and prayers. No one, however, offered booze or drugs.

After developing Covid and all its long-term effects, the docs decided that my prostate was not just inflamed, but that I had prostate cancer. Before completing that biopsy, Dr. Del Paine noticed how much hand swelling I had, and ordered a rheumatology panel. Of course, it came back positive, such that now I have a new diagnosis of rheumatoid arthritis.... and I still have the Covid symptoms. The biopsy of the prostate came back positive, as bad as could be, so I'm dealing with three fairly new disease states at the same time.

I'm taking new medication for both RA and cancer, and they are both starting to work a little. I can now walk 100 yards with a cane, but I have no stamina, little appetite. My taste buds are starting to work again, but they don't match up with my sense of smell (too weird). I am going to the oncologist next week and we'll determine the next steps. So far they haven't recommended surgery.

It'll be a couple more months until I'm well enough to do anything with Rotary. So Jim, if you could come pick up the checkbook and some other Endowment material some time, that would be great. Hopefully, you've found someone to do the scholarships, and you can write out the checks for DCA and Delta.

The board will need to determine what to use the DDF for next year and who will run meetings for the next couple of months.

Dianne, I see you're helping Karen with speakers... Thanks.

Andy, sorry if this gets pushed back to you....AGAIN. I suggest the board meet and determine what to do.

Hopefully, I'll improve soon and start working again, but for now I need all the rest I can get. Thanks for understanding. Bill

Evan Stone of Verve

Spoke to us today about what's the State of the Information Technology Industry?







Past President Evan Stone spoke to us today about the State of Technology, his livelihood. He started with the history of his career, ascension from cyber security at UOP, succeeding and then losing his job when he cracked the case. He had learned enough to be dangerous. He got hired at Verve to be a trainer in 1994. He was their first trainer, then he went to be a technical trainer. He was in on the ground floor. After two or three years he was hired by Novell. They did small business service hardware. He was assigned to their biggest client Internationally.

He then started his own Computer Business and did it for 10 years. He then went back to Verve. Every new area they go into he ends up heading it up. He is now an aligner, he identi-

fies what companies need for the coming year. Verve now has 36 people, with 25 of those in the service department.

So what is the State of IT Industry? To know that you have to recognize the pace of technological change. It's increasing rapidly. From the monster main frames to modern PCs, size, speed, affordability and software aree changing dramatically. Business's information can now be stored securing in "The Cloud". The Cloud is an assortment of data centers.

With the rise of Artificial Intelligence, the creation of Automated Workplaces with Chat Agbt and the cloud, you need Verve because this is all getting too complicated! You have generative AI, (you have to start it), and Reactive AI (it has the ability to react to certain events. How can you keep up with the technological changes?

With the millions of square feet the clouds require, two main concerns are electricity and water. An extreme amount of power is required. The heat from the Cloud computers is so intense that radiated water coolers must run through the facility.

Security in the Cloud is a huge concern. Evan said it's more secure in the cloud than in your building. Data has verification codes to make it more secure. It's also very important for Verve to stay ahead of the curve.

Evan, thanks for the talk, it was a little over my head and I tried to put your message across.

President Andy thanked **Evan** and had him sign a computer. **Andy** asked for any more input and **Richard Carr** had to relate his tradition of Maple Syrup gift he receives every year from a weekend of constructing a cabin in Vermont, before he was married, for his friend. Very sweet!
