When he was little, she noticed that he had some learning issues. He didn't make eye contact, he had difficulty socializing and didn't talk until later than most toddlers. She knew something was wrong, so she had him tested. As it turned out, he had a mild form of autism. Because she acted early, had good health coverage, and knew how to work with the school system, she was able to get him the training and education he needed by age 2 1/2. Early treatment is critical to long-term success in managing symptoms. He is now a thriving adult who is in college and looking towards career options in computer technology. I had only been in practice for a few weeks. The shrill sound of my pager filled the restaurant and put all eyes on me as I apologized to my dinner companions. I headed out the door, quarters in hand, to the pay phone where I got news from the nurse that she couldn't find fetal heart tones in a pregnant woman who had just arrived at our labor unit from her home down the road. Only a block away and decidedly more fit than I am today, I ran to the hospital. We had the baby out by Cesarean section in just a few minutes. The pediatrician, who clearly had answered his pager just as quickly, successfully resuscitated the baby. That child grew up to play Division I collegiate football and has been a high school teacher for many years.
