Polio Statistics as of September 1, 2024…

Unfortunately there were 6 new wild Polio cases and 8 cases of Vaccine-Derived Polio this week alone, bringing the total to 33 cases of wild Polio for the 2024 year-to-date. This time last year we had only a total of 7, with

12 cases for the entire year. (Vaccine-derived poliovirus is a well-documented strain of poliovirus mutated from the strain originally contained in OPV.) Read More
