President, Pasadena Showcase House for the Arts "Behind the Scenes at the Pasadena Showcase House"



Matt McIntyre became President of Pasadena Showcase House for the Arts earlier this year, notable as the first male member to serve in the organization's 77-year history. Active since 2018, he has held various board and benefit positions, including as Benefit Chair of the Pasadena Showcase House of Design in 2023. He's excited to lead the organization through its 60th Showcase House. Celebrated as one of the nation's oldest and most successful home and garden tours, the Pasadena Showcase House of Design raises funds for music and arts programs, and has given \$26 million to local nonprofits since 1948.

McIntyre also volunteers as a long-time member of the Tournament of Roses and as a docent at the Gamble

House. Professionally, he has had a successful career in real estate, and is currently an agent with Berkshire Hathaway HomeServices California Properties. He was named Pasadena's Realtor of the Year in 2018.

After browsing through the latest December Rotary magazine, the morning after our annual Holiday Party, I read an interesting article about alternative places to travel internationally.

According to the U.S. TSA, summer air travel alone has reached record heights in 2024 and it was already an issue prior to the pandemic. Tourism Cares, is a non-profit organization dedicated to advancing sustainability within the tourism industry and seeks out alternative, less populated locations. Some of the places that were recommended, and should be contemplated, are listed below.

The islands of Azores, which belong to Portugal, include nine major volcanic islands and are referred to as Europe's Hawaii. The largest island, Sao Miguel, is known for its geysers, and caldrea lakes. The nearby islands of Pico or Faial are places to go scuba diving or to see whales.



The Indonesian Isles, home of the Indonesian archipelago, contains approximately 17,000 islands with hundreds of diverse cultures and ethnic groups. This region lies within the heart of the Coral Triangle, where the oceans are at their most biodiverse. While Bali is beautiful, there are many other places equally as wonderful.

Umbria is a region of Italy that is located in central Italy, between Florence and Rome. There are Baroque churches in the regional capital Perugia or medieval hilltop towns and villages such as Orvieto. Trevi is also a hilltop town with undulating green landscapes that is known for its food and wine.

Rotary members in particular know the power of the bonds forged when people from different cultures meet and exchange ideas and dreams. Consider taking the path less traveled.






