NAOMI HIRAHARA

"Pasadena Girl Investigates: How Japanese Influences and Immigrants Transformed a City"



Naomi Hirahara was born in Pasadena, California. Her father, Isamu (known as "Sam"), was also born in California, but was taken to Hiroshima, Japan, as an infant. He was only miles away from the epicenter of the atomic-bombing in 1945, yet survived. Naomi's mother, Mayumi, or "May," was born in Hiroshima and lost her father in the blast. Shortly after the end of World War II, Sam returned to California and eventually established himself in the gardening and landscaping trade in the Los Angeles area. After Sam

married May in Hiroshima in 1960, the couple made their new home in Altadena and then South Pasadena, where Naomi and her younger brother Jimmy grew up.

Naomi is an Edgar Award-winning author of multiple traditional mystery series and noir short stories. Her Mas Arai mysteries, which have been published in Japanese, Korean and French, to feature an Altadena gardener and Hiroshima survivor who solves crimes.

Her first historical mystery, Clark and Division, which won a Mary Higgins Clark Award, follows a Japanese American family's move to Chicago in 1944 after being released from a California wartime detention center. A former journalist with The Rafu Shimpo newspaper, Naomi has also written numerous non-fiction history books including the award-winning *Terminal Island: Lost Communities on America's Edge* and curated exhibitions. She has also written a middle-grade novel, 1001 Cranes. Her follow-up to Clark and Division, Evergreen, was released in August 2023 and was on the USA Today bestseller list for two weeks.

Her next Japantown mystery, set in 1903 Pasadena, will be released in February 2026.

I am in the process of putting together an ad hoc group to present information to our Pasadena and Altadena Rotarians in terms of public and private resources available to them. 
