

Rick Chou gave us a very impressive, yet understandable, introduction to CGI (Computer Generated Imagery) at last week's meeting. Coming from a background in photography--before it was digital—Rick has the artistic instincts to match with the new tools of the CGI era. With the help of his partners located around the world, Rick has been able to provide CGI for top companies and institutions like Lexus, Boeing, Pratt & Whitney, the US Navy, and the Natural History Museum. Rick showed how his team developed a live presentation for the Museum of Natural History and then showed us the impressive result. Rick started teaching himself the tricks of this new capability 25 years ago at the request of his customers. He says that people must teach themselves when a new technology is emerging. He continues to learn along with his partners, most of whom are younger than him. His company, Blue Sky, believes in thinking outside the box.
