She co-founded a fabrication and production business in 2007; it grew from the humble beginnings of 3 in their garage to a fun and always exciting decade-long career in corporate events and retail installations with 15 employees and a 25,000 sq ft building. After selling her interest in the company in 2016, Kryssie returned to school at LBCC as a single mom. Through her non-linear educational path, she completed two associate degrees and then went on to receive her undergrad in Sociology from Cal State San Marcos and hopes to pursue her Masterâ€[™]s in Social Work in her spare time.

Sheâ€[™]s raising her children in Long Beach. They include a graduate who is considering a career in the Navy, a nationally ranked sophomore wrestler, and a 2nd grader who is thriving in the LBUSDâ€[™]s Special Education program.

Kryssie spent 12 years on the PTA Board, and four years (two separate terms) on the school site council. She is a member of the Hawaiian Civic Club, and a grief group facilitator for elementary-aged students in the schools and for teens as part of a family bereavement program with Pathways Caregiving and Hospice.

Kryssie became a **Trauma Intervention Program** volunteer in 2023 and immediately connected with the mission. She joined the National TIP Organization as the Director of Operations and Development in March, excited to help TIP grow. When the Program Director position for Long Beach opened, Kryssie knew that combining the mission of TIP, with the direct service and impact on our city, would be purposeful and impactful.


I have asked the Membership Committee to review the membership process to see if we can speed it up to help keep potential new members engaged.
