The Walk of Dreams: Finding Fame in Hollywood (or Wherever Life Leads)

President Emeritus, Hollywood Chamber of Commerce

Leron Gubler is the former President/CEO of the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce, a position he held for approximately 27 years. In that capacity, he participated in more than 600 Hollywood Walk of Fame ceremonies and presided over 300 ceremonies.

A native of the Central Valley town of Porterville, Gubler earned a Master of Public Administration degree at Brigham Young University before starting a career in organizational management in 1978 at the Santa Monica Chamber of Commerce. In 1980, he was named Executive Director of the San Pedro Peninsula Chamber of Commerce, where he served for 12 years. Over those years, he had a lot of interaction with the Long Beach Chamber and with the Port of Long Beach. In 1992, he was named President of the Hollywood Chamber of Commerce, a famous organization which at the time was in turmoil and nearly bankrupt. He learned to overcome adversity and helped to revitalize not only the Chamber but the community of Hollywood as well.

Since retiring, Gubler has been busy with community service, taking care of his teenage children, and wrote the first general interest book about the world-famous Hollywood Walk of Fame.


Business Breakfast Roundtable - IN PERSON at International City Bank
