Rotary's First Leader

Paul Harris was the founder and the first president of Rotary International. He established the organization in 1905 with the goal of bringing together professionals from diverse backgrounds to exchange ideas and form meaningful, lifelong friendships. Here are some key points about Paul Harris and his leadership in Rotary:

1. **Founding Rotary**: Paul Harris, a lawyer, founded the first Rotary club in Chicago on February 23, 1905. The club initially had four members, who met to discuss their professional experiences and network.

2. **Rotary's Growth**: Under Harris's leadership, Rotary quickly expanded beyond Chicago. By 1910, there were 16 Rotary clubs across the United States, and Rotary International was formed to accommodate its growing reach.

3. First President: Paul Harris served as the first president of the Rotary Club of Chicago. His leadership set the foundation for Rotary's values and goals, emphasizing service above self and fostering international understanding.

4. Legacy: Harris's vision and leadership have had a lasting impact. Rotary International now has over 1.2 million members in more than 35,000 clubs worldwide, continuing his mission of service and fellowship.


Trip to Rotary International Headquarters


