Polio Eradication: Rotary's #1 Goal

The global eradication of polio is, and must remain, the primary goal of Rotary International and its Foundation until the world is certified as polio-free. Let's look at how Rotary has made the eradication of polio the priority, and the results.

More than half of the amount spent by the Rotary Foundation last year was for polio eradication due to the continuing generosity of our members, clubs, DDF allocations, and the 2 to 1 match from the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. Over 800 million children received the oral polio vaccine last year. There are now over twenty million people walking on earth who would be paralyzed if not for Rotary starting the Global Polio Eradication initiative. Vitamin A drops given to children at the same time as the polio vaccine have prevented 1.25 million deaths by decreasing susceptibility to infectious diseases.
