Responding to the Gaza Polio Outbreak

A Message from RI Director Dan Himelspach



Rotary's December theme is Disease Prevention and Treatment. We can proudly report that Big West Clubs have historically and currently sponsored a wide variety of Disease Prevention and Treatment projects around the world.

Our initiative to eradicate the dreadful poliovirus is by far our largest and most profound disease prevention program. We have labeled it "Rotary's Number 1 Outside Priority."

In the last few months, we have received disturbing news about the fight to end polio. Cases have increased and we are experiencing challenges in high-risk areas like Afghanistan, Pakistan, and northern Nigeria where complex humanitarian crises hinder progress.

In September we responded to a polio outbreak in Gaza, with our first vaccination campaign reaching over 560,000 children. Recently a second round vaccinated nearly 557,000 children for polio and more than 448,000 children received vitamin A. Polio immunization requires two shots about four weeks apart and vaccination of approximately 90% of the people in a community.

Wednesday, December 11, 6:00 pm on Zoom "The War That Never Ended"

Our December meeting features a presentation by Angel Pilato, Lt. Col. USAF (Ret.), PhD. Her story, "The War That Never Ended," will focus on UXO (Unexploded ordnance) in Laos that are still as deadly today as they were 50 years ago.

Even though there are millions of UXO still in Vietnam and Cambodia, Pilato selected Laos because it was the most heavily bombed country per capita in the world. On a more personal note, Angel reported that a lot of the pilots from her base were shot down and killed in Laos

These unexploded UXO remain active after 50+ years and it may take 100 years to ever see the land totally free of them. It will be a fascinating story and Angel is fully committed to the removal of UXO in Laos that remain deadly, especially to children.




