LA Disaster District Service Project Update

The Rotary District 5500 LA Disaster Service Project stands as an outstanding example of the strength of Rotary's commitment to service and community support, especially in times of need.

Through the leadership of dedicated individuals like Joe Puett, Wendy Guyton, Robert Miller, Marcos Ramirez and Matt Nance, this initiative quickly came together, and the photos of the truck filled with donations speak volumes about the collective effort and coordination of Rotarians across the district. Their leadership and tireless work set the stage for what has become a powerful example of Rotary's ability to mobilize resources in response to disaster.

Significant and heartfelt thanks go to Rotarians Robert Miller and Mike Mills from the Casa Grande Club. Robert organized the transport of funds and resources, and Mike drove the truck to Los Angeles. Their efforts, along with the support of their families, exemplify the selflessness and dedication that Rotary

members demonstrate in their pursuit of helping those in need.

When the truck arrived in LA, PDG Hank Huisking and her husband Peter were there to meet it, providing a warm and welcoming reception for the generous donations. Their presence underlined the heartfelt gratitude and unity within the Rotary community as they received the much-needed supplies to support the disaster response.

Beyond the tangible donations, the success of this project highlights the incredible financial contributions made by individual Rotarians, as well as the clubs and regions coming together to amplify their impact. Many clubs have stepped up by sending checks, and regional collaborations have taken this effort even further. For example, the Green Valley and Valle

Verde clubs, at the Spaghetti Spree event, challenged all the clubs in their region to raise \$10,000, which shows the power of collective action and friendly competition to achieve a common goal. Similarly, the Mountain Empire Club's Community Dinner raised over \$2,500 for the cause, demonstrating how even smaller events can generate meaningful support for disaster relief efforts. And the San Luis Frontera club is currently conducting a community-wide fundraising campaign for this cause.

What makes this project particularly special is the way it allowed Rotarians to respond in multiple ways, directly connecting with their own families, friends, and communities who may have been impacted by the disaster in LA. The ability to mobilize quickly, whether through financial contributions, fundraising events, or





direct physical aid like the truck delivery, underscores the versatility of Rotary's service model. It's clear that the disaster affected not just those in LA, but also those who have ties to the area, creating a sense of urgency and solidarity that propelled this project forward.

Arizona Rotary Microcredit Program

The Arizona Microcredit Program is a joint service project that has been going on for many years between District 5500 and District 5495, much like The Rotary Vocational Fund of AZ (TRVFA), the Rotary Mexico-USA Friendship Conference and the Arizona Days of Service.

The program provides loans through a Mexican partner financial institute to low-income, mostly female Mexicans in Sonora who are trying to stay in their homeland and start or continue small businesses to support themselves and their families. Originally funded by a series of three Rotary Global Grants in 2014, 2015 and 2016 totaling about \$277,000, it has now made well over \$4.4 million in loans through use of its revolving or cyclical design- as loans are paid off, the funds are lent out again and again to others. Not very many other Rotary grant or aid programs can claim this level of efficiency!



By recently adding over \$75,000 in additional funds provided by individual Rotarians and clubs, the AZ Microcredit Program will even further enhance its ability to help support these industrious entrepreneurs in their efforts to be self-supporting.

TRF Weekly Message: How Do District Grants Help at Home?

A Rotary club in the United States used a \$3,000 district grant to purchase food and personal care items for a local food pantry that saw a 50% increase in need. A Rotary club in India is using a district grant to provide hygiene kits and training to girls who might otherwise miss school when they are menstruating. The project aims to help 40,000 girls.

Clubs worldwide use district grants to support similar short-term projects in their communities.






