This is a situation that none of us ever expected to experience. The word "apocalyptic" is accurate, both in the images that you see in the media and what we are experiencing in our neighborhoods. But what they don't show is the human side: people whose homes and businesses are now gone and their lives changed forever. Let that sink in. Peter and I are currently in mandatory evacuation status at my daughter's home in Los Angeles.

I want you all to know how brave and amazing the First Responders have been during this difficult time. They and all the volunteers are working hard to help whenever and wherever they can.

My new Rotary District, D5300, is having a president's meeting to coordinate relief efforts, and my own Sierra Madre Rotary Club is meeting this morning (Jan 14) to support each other (one member lost her home and everything) and to help assess our local community needs.

Tucson Hope Factory

What's been happening around Tucson to provide transitional housing, in the form of micro shelters, for our unhoused neighbors?

Dave Gamrath, who has been involved with tiny house projects in the Seattle area, is now working on a similar project in Tucson. The project is a positive solution for the homeless, and many Rotarians are involved in construction in Seattle. Dave has given presentations to Valle Verde and Tubac Rotary Clubs.

This past June, the Tucson City Council and Mayor unanimously approved Tucson's first micro shelter village, the **Amphi Housing First Resource Center**, which will be located at old fire station 8, at 250 W King Rd. It was a year-long process to get zoning approval for the project. Current Tucson zoning does not include micro shelter villages, due to villages being new to the area. For that, a special zoning process, a "PAD," had to be conducted. This village will include 35 micro shelters on the property.

Here is a schematic of what the village could look like, completed by pro bono architects from Seattle.

The existing buildings will be refurbished into needed common areas, including a kitchen, bathrooms, showers, laundry, offices for social workers onsite, etc. The city indicated that an environmental impact study needed to be completed prior to sending out RFPs to potential suppliers of the micro shelters, and for a contractor to refurb the existing buildings.



A Journey of Leadership, Cultural Exchange, and Dedication to Clean Water in Thailand

Join me for a journey to Thailand in March 2025.

In 1995, I was honored to lead a Rotary 5500 group to Northern Thailand's District 3360. Our goal was to visit local Rotary Clubs, learn about their culture, and attend the annual District Conference. During one visit, hosted by Dr. Suthep—a visionary who had built a modern hospital—we toured a small school that left a lasting impression.

The classroom was nearly bare, with no books and minimal furniture. The principal introduced us to a young boy, just entering his teenage years, whose life had been tragically altered. He had consumed polluted water during elementary school, resulting in severe brain damage. That moment changed everything for me—I resolved to focus future efforts on clean water initiatives.

Through Rotary and local grants, Thai Rotarians and our team worked together to bring clean water to schools. To date, an estimated 20,000 students now have access to safe drinking water. As we prepare for our next visit, we remain committed to expanding this mission and ensuring clean water access for even more communities.

Our Friendship Experience will include visits for 7 to 10 Rotary clubs in Northen Thailand. We will share dreams of how Rotary might deepen the way we work together to serve our communities here and there. This time together will also focus on deepening our personal ties to each other with a better understanding of our history and culture.

The current schedule has us leaving Los Angles on March 24 and arriving in Bangkok on March 25. We plan to leave Bangkok on April 10.

Save The Date! District Dinner at Calgary Convention


If you're planning to attend the Rotary International Convention in Calgary, don't miss our District 5500 dinner on Tuesday, June 24.


