## Bringing Water to a Kenyan Village: A Rotary Success Story

An estimated 785 million people worldwide lack access to clean water.

Rotary International, Rotary Districts, and Rotary Clubs are partnering to address these issues.

Three years ago, a village in Kenya faced a harsh reality—its only water source was an hour's walk away. Recognizing the urgent need for clean and accessible water, a dedicated team came together to bring a lasting solution.

The effort was led by **Mary Muroki**, the village matriarch, who shared their plight with **Rotarian Dennis Bergquist** from the **Tucson Kino Rotary Club**. Dennis then assembled a collaborative team, including **Catherine Mutua**, President of the **Masaai Mara Rotary Club in Narok**, **Kenya**, who took on the local Rotary responsibilities. Joining them was **Fred Rue**, a U.S.-based Rotarian experienced in writing global water grants, along with a skilled engineer from Kenya. This team brought together the expertise and determination needed to turn the vision into reality.

It does so through the funds which come from TRF to District 5500 every year through District Designated Funds (DDF), which D5500 then uses to provide Distrct Grants and Global Grants to your and my clubs. PLEASE consider starting or increasing your giving to the TRF Annual Fund! \

The amount we get from TRF depends on the amount we donate to the TRF Annual Fund SHARE three years prior, as funds are invested by TRF and the earnings over the three years are used to fund RI operations and then the donated funds are split between the World Fund and DDF. The World Fund provides money for RI Global Grants and programs, including PolioPlus, Rotary Peace Centers, the Endowment Fund (for areas of focus) and more.

Through Rotary Foundation global grants, members can support future leaders whose career goals align with fields related to our areas of focus.

These scholarships are awarded for at least \$30,000 and can fund graduate-level coursework or research for one to four academic years. A key feature of global grants is the partnership between the district or club where the person will study and the district or club in their





