Supporting the Foundation's Annual Fund-SHARE

As many of you know, the **Annual Fund-SHARE** is the cornerstone of The Rotary Foundation's work, providing vital resources for our programs and areas of focus. Through the SHARE system, your contributions to the Foundation are transformed into grants that fund local and international humanitarian projects, scholarships, vocational training teams, and more.

Each year, donations directed to the Annual Fund - SHARE from clubs in our district are split between the **World Fund** and our district's **District Designated Fund (DDF)**.

After three years, our district can use the DDF to support the projects our clubs select. We allocate half of their DDF to fund district grants, while the remaining DDF can be used for global grants or directed toward initiatives such as **PolioPlus** and **Rotary Peace Centers**.

Donations to the Foundation are essential to securing and expanding our programs throughout the world. We recognize with gratitude clubs that make extraordinary contributions.

• 100% Paul Harris Fellow Club: These are clubs in which all dues-paying members are Paul Harris Fellows. The club receives Kotary a banner. This is a one-time recognition, but the intent is that the club will maintain its status.



OUNDATION

• 100% Foundation Giving Club: This banner is given to clubs that have an average of \$100 in per capita giving and in which every dues-paying member donates at least \$25 during the year to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, the Endowment, or approved global grants

• Every Rotarian, Every Year Club: This banner is awarded to clubs that have a minimum Annual Fund contribution of \$100 per capita during the year and in which every dues-paying member personally contributes at least \$25 to the Annual Fund in that time period. <u>Read More</u>




