Jacob Vasquez is a real estate investor and native of Austin. In his spare time, he likes to read, play pickleball and develop himself mentally and physically. Welcome Jacob Vasquez!

Jill Goodman is the Executive Director of Central Texas Jill Goodman is the Executive Director of Central Tesas' 2th best leadership development program next to Rotary (mile). In her speech, Jill shared tools on how we can get past polarization and have meaningful dialogue. Jill outlined three steps to meaningful dialogue that avoids further polarization, including 1) Establish a collaborative ogol, 2) get curious, and 3) get personal -tell a personal story and encouraged us to use these tools in our own lives.

Drawing on his public and private sector experience, Casselberry authored "Straight Up: The Business of Winning Politics, Communication Strategies for Innovative Companies." The book provides a roadmap for companies to effectively integrate a strategic communications plan into a successful business plan.

He is a regular contributor to Texas CEO Magazine, a published commentator on policy matters and host of the "Texas Business and Policy Report" on NBC Austin.

- Early Act First Knight character programs @Harris, Hart, Wayside and Pecan Springs Elementary Schools teaching students the Four Way Test, character traits to live by and reducing referrals to the office by 50+%-Rotary volunteers can attend the monthly knighting ceremonies and cheer on the selected winners for the current trait and congratulate the parents that attend. (Monthly-master schedule arranged each year with the schools and members are asked to sign up for any date they can attend.)
- Books for Me program @ Pecan Springs: Rotary volunteers hand out free books to students (Twice a year-Fall and Spring-volunteers sign up for a 30-45 min. block in advance to hand out books to the children and help them write their name inside so they can take it home and add it to their home library-encourages students to read at home)
- Helping Hand Home Events for Abused Children(three events per vear);
 - Splash Day: Rotary Volunteers organize and volunteer for Splash Day usually between July and August. Volunteers come to the Helping Hand Home and supervise the Splash day activities (water slides, arts & crafts, photo center) and serve lunch to counselors, children and volunteers.
 - Christmas party: Rotary Volunteers wrap Christmas presents after the Tuesday Rotary meeting a week before the Christmas party. The night of the Christmas party (usually the second or third Tuesday evening in December for two hours), the volunteers hand out treats, sing Christmas carols, help kids unwrap presents and interact with the children and counselors. Rotary volunteers also serve as Santa and the elf to hand out the Christmas gifts selected by each child with the help of the counselors back in November and sponsored by the Rotary Club.
 - Cluster Lunch for Helping Hand Home counselors and children: Rotary Volunteers collect and set up lunch for the Home and serve it to all the children and counselors. (Usually set up in the Spring and event takes about two hours at lunchtime)
- Scholarships for Selected High School graduates in the Austin area: Rotary Volunteers sign up to serve on this committee to work with the high school counselors to select candidates, the candidates are then interviewed by a Rotarian, the committee selected the winning students and the winners and their familied are invited to s Scholarship Presentation Dinner where the winners are announced and given their scholarships. (three-four month commitment usually January-April)
- Clothes Drives for the UT Career Closet: Rotarian Volunteers round up gently used business clothes and deliver them to the UT Career Closet. Clothes are collected at the Rotary meetings. (twice a year-Fall and Spring
- Book Donation weekly for Lively Middle School library: The books are selected from a list provided by the Librarian, signed by our speaker each week and a Rotarian Volunteer collects the books and delivers them to Lively Middle School. (Weekly)
- Clothes for primary students at Pecan Springs: Rotary Club collects children's clothes at the beginning of the school year and delivers them to Pecan Springs clothes closet (once a year)
- Rotary Gardening Day at Community First: Rotary Volunteers & friends can sign up to work on an assigned date to help Community First plant sustainable gardens that serve the homeless people living at Community First, provides food to be handed out to the homeless communities by the Mobile, Loaves and Fishes Van or to be sold at Community First to buy plants and seeds for the next harvest. (usually four times a year on prearranged dates- a 2 hr. shift each time)
- Two Blood Drives for Austin: Rotary volunteers and friends can sign up to give blood on the assigned blood drive day held at the Rotary meeting place twice a year (Once in Fall and once in Spring-45 min. -1 hour commitment)
- Rise Against Hunger: Central Texas Rotarians and quests gather to support the Rise Against Hunger foundation at a meal packing event. At the event, we work together from start-to-finish in a meal assembly experience to combine rice, soy, dehydrated vegetables and a packet of 20 vitamins and minerals into life-changing meal packages.



Matias Segura

Superintendent - Austin ISD

Matias Segura is the superintendent of the Austin Independent School District, serving more than 74,000 students and 10,000 employees.

The Austin ISD Board of Trustees chose Matias Segura as the lone finalist for Austin ISD's superintendent position. The decision was made unanimously during the December 14 meeting.

Segura was officially appointed permanent superintendent by a unanimous board vote Jan. 25, 2024.

Segura served as interim superintendent beginning January 9, 2023.

He first joined the district in 2018 as the Operations Officer and led the implementation of the \$1.05 billion 2017 Bond.

He went on to lead the Long-range Planning process as chief of operations, which was the largest-scale application of the Equity by Design process in district history. The process served as the foundation of the record-breaking \$2.4 billion 2022 Bond as well as the non-operational strategies included in the Long-range Plan.

As superintendent, Segura is focused on the generational impact of Austin ISD in Central Texas. Strong community partnerships and support of Austin ISD are at the core of this work and reinforce his belief that Strong Schools make a Stronger Austin.

During his time as superintendent, the district has seen a 20% increase in our retention rate over two years, largely due to a culture of respect and a positive climate with students, staff and community. He has also focused on transforming the special education student experience by working with the Texas Education Agency to develop a stringent path for accountability to serve families.

Segura is a Professional Engineer with a Bachelor of Science degree in civil engineering from Texas Tech University and a Master of Business Administration degree in finance from the University of Texas at Austin. In July 2024, he completed the Texas Superintendents' Certification Institute program and received his superintendent certification by the State Board for Educator Certification/Texas Education Agency. He is a product of Austin ISD, a father of two daughters who attend Austin ISD and his mother taught at Austin ISD for 42 years.
