February 18, 2025 Gordon Daugherty

Gordon Daugherty is a bestselling author, seasoned business executive, startup advisor and investor. He is co-founder and chairman of Capital Factory, where he spends 100 percent of his time educating, advising, and investing in startups. Gordon took us on a trip down memory lane with the stated objective of dispossessing us or anyone listening, from the notion that Austin's high-tech and startup growth occurred in the last 10 or 20 years. He gave some interesting statistics comparing 1990s Austin to Austin in 2025 where today's population and economy are five times greater while the growth in startups and venture capital is 50 times greater. According to Gordon, the foundation for this growth started in the 50s, 60s and 70s with the location of IBM and AMD and a focus on hardware. Then in the 80s came Sematech. Those development spurred initiatives like Tivoli and Trilogy that launched the enterprise software wave in Austin.

Next Gordon took us through the founding of the Capitol Factory. He and his co-founder sought to replicate the tech incubators in California, originally offering to help them locate in Austin. When the California interests declined, they decided to go it alone and started the three month boot camp for startups which eventually became the Capitol Factory. The Capital Factory set out to be the Center of Gravity for Entrepreneurs in Austin, helping entrepreneurs find the three fundamental truths for success, money, customers and talent. Since then, the mission has expanded throughout Texas as has the tagline "Center of Gravity for Entrepreneurs in Texas." The Capital Factory has become the most active early-stage venture capital fund in the nation and was instrumental in attracting the Army Futures Command to Austin.

We know these students and all that participated in Camp Enterprise will go far.


